choosing where to register

Before you can begin your baby registry, you need to decide where to register! We polled the MLN community, and the majority of women use *Amazon* for their registry with *Babylist* as a close runner-up. Those two platforms were far and away the most popular!

For the sake of thoroughness, I want to give you a list of things to consider when choosing where to register:

 Variety of products: Look for a retailer with a wide range of baby products, from clothes and toys to strollers and car seats. You want to have plenty of options to choose from so that you can customize your registry to fit your needs



- **Ease of use:** The registry platform should be easy to navigate, with clear instructions and helpful features like filtering options, search functions, and user-friendly interfaces
- **Completion discount:** Some retailers offer a discount on any items that remain on your registry after your due date has passed. This can be a great incentive to choose a particular retailer for your registry
- **Registry perks:** Look for retailers that offer perks for creating a registry with them, such as free samples, gift cards, or other rewards

Now, knowing that the two most popular platforms are Amazon's Baby Registry and Babylist, I thought we could look at some pros and cons of each platform.

Amazon Baby Registry Pros and Cons

Pros

- Largest selection of baby products available: Amazon offers a huge variety of baby products, from popular brands to harder-to-find items and specialty brands
- User-friendly interface: Amazon's registry system is easy to use and navigate, making it simple to add and manage items on your list
- Free shipping for Prime members on eligible items: If you have a Prime membership, you can take advantage of free shipping on eligible items, which can save you money in the long run
- Option to receive a completion discount: Amazon offers a 15% completion discount on eligible items remaining on your registry that weren't purchased, allowing you to save money on the things you still need (read the fine print here)
- Free and easy returns and exchanges: If you receive a gift that you don't want or need, Amazon makes it easy to return or exchange the item for free for up to 1 year



- **Group-gifting:** Amazon's baby registry does allow for group gifting on more expensive items
- **Diaper fund:** Amazon has a diaper fund option that people can contribute to, but be aware that the fund will be delivered to you via Amazon Gift Cards

Cons

- Shipping times may be longer for some items: Depending on the availability of the item, shipping times may be longer than you'd like
- **Third-party sellers:** While Amazon offers a wide variety of products, some specialty items may only be available through third-party sellers, which may have less reliable shipping and customer service. Be mindful of this when adding items to your registry
- Limited ability to customize registry layout and appearance: Amazon's registry system offers limited customization options, so you won't be able to create a unique look or layout for your registry

Babylist Registry Pros and Cons

Pros

- Universal registry: Babylist allows you to add items from any store or website, so you're not limited to just one retailer. This is a huge benefit if you know you want to register for items from multiple different websites
- **Customizable:** You can personalize your registry by adding notes, photos, and even experiences (like a meal train or diaper service)
- **Cash gifts:** Babylist allows for cash gifts, which can be used towards bigger items or items not found on traditional registries
- **Group gifting:** You can add expensive items to your list and allow guests to chip in together
- **Completion discount:** You get access to a 15% completion discount to the Babylist shop
- Free samples: Babylist partners with some brands to offer free samples and discounts to registry creators



 Mobile app: The Babylist app is user-friendly and allows you to scan barcodes in-store to easily add items to your registry

Cons

- Not as well-known: Babylist is not as widely used as some other registry platforms, so some guests may not be familiar with it
- **Potential shipping issues:** Because you can add items from any store, guests may accidentally ship to the wrong address or use the wrong shipping method
- **Transaction fees:** Babylist charges a transaction fee for cash gifts, which can be a downside for some users
- Limited perks: While Babylist does offer some free samples and discounts, they don't have as many perks as some other registry platforms

Strollers are an essential item you'll need as a new parent. They allow you to easily take your little one on outings, whether it's a walk around the block or a trip to the store.

But with so many different types of strollers available, it can be tough to know which one is right for you and your lifestyle.

Travel Systems

A travel system is an infant car seat, car seat base, and stroller all wrapped into one! These strollers are designed to work with an infant car seat, making it easy to move your baby from the car to the stroller without having to unbuckle them or disturb their sleep.

Pros

- **Convenience:** With a travel system, you can easily move your baby from the car to the stroller without disturbing their sleep, which can be a lifesaver when you're out and about
- Versatility: Most travel systems can be used as a traditional stroller once your baby outgrows their infant car seat, making them a great long-term investment
- Compatibility: Travel systems are designed to work with specific infant car seats, so you can be sure that your car seat and stroller will work together seamlessly





Cons

- **Cost:** Travel system strollers can be more expensive than traditional strollers or infant car seats alone, which may not fit everyone's budget

- Do I want a travel system with additional features, such as a reversible seat, adjustable handlebars, cupholders, etc.?
- Do I prefer a travel system with a sleek and modern look, or one with a more classic and traditional appearance?

Umbrella Strollers (Lightweight Strollers)

Pros

Double Strollers

Double strollers are a must-have for parents of multiples or for those with a baby and toddler. They allow you to easily transport two children at once, whether you're out for a walk or running errands.

Side-by-side double strollers

- **Better visibility:** With both children sitting next to each other, it's easier for them to interact and see the world around them
- **Equal weight distribution:** With the weight of the children evenly distributed, it can be easier to maneuver and steer the stroller

Questions to ask yourself about tandem design options:

- Will I be using the stroller in tight spaces, such as in stores or on public transportation?
- Will my children prefer sitting in different positions, such as facing forward or backward?
- Do I have a smaller vehicle or limited storage space at home?
- Am I comfortable with a stroller that may be more difficult to steer due to uneven weight distribution?

Jogging Strollers

If you enjoy running or jogging, a jogging stroller can be a great investment for keeping up with your fitness routine while spending quality time with your little one.

These strollers are designed with three sturdy wheels, all-terrain tires, and a suspension system to provide a smooth ride for your child, even on bumpy surfaces.

Questions to ask yourself before choosing a jogging stroller:

- What type of terrain will I be running on (e.g. pavement, dirt trails, or a mix)?
- How often do I plan on using the jogging stroller for running or jogging?
- Will I be using the jogging stroller for other activities, such as walking or hiking?
- Do I want a jogging stroller that can also be used as an everyday stroller?
- How easy is the jogging stroller to maneuver and steer while running?
- How much storage space do I have in my car and at home for the jogging stroller?
- How much does the jogging stroller weigh, and can I comfortably lift it?
- Is the jogging stroller compatible with my child's car seat, or do I need to purchase a separate one?
- Does the jogging stroller have a hand brake for added safety?
- Is the jogging stroller easy to fold and store when not in use?
- Do I prefer a jogging stroller with a fixed or swivel front wheel?

Car Seats and Accessories

Choosing the right car seat for your baby is one of the most important decisions you'll make as a parent.

Car seats provide essential protection for your child during car rides, and it's important to choose one that fits your child's age, weight, and height, as well as your vehicle.

Questions to consider and research before choosing a car seat:

- What is the weight and height limit of the car seat? Make sure the car seat is appropriate for your child's age, weight, and height
- What is the installation process like? Check to see if the car seat is easy to install and has clear instructions
- Does the car seat fit well in your vehicle? Not all car seats fit well in all cars, so make sure to check compatibility before purchasing
- Is the car seat comfortable for your child? Look for a car seat with enough padding and support to keep your child comfortable on long car rides
- What safety features does the car seat have? Look for a car seat with features such as a five-point harness, side-impact protection, and energy-absorbing foam lining
- Does the car seat come with a warranty? Consider purchasing a car seat with a warranty to protect your investment in case of defects or issues
- What is the car seat's reputation for safety and reliability? Look up reviews and safety ratings from trusted sources to ensure you're making a safe choice for your child
- Does the car seat meet your lifestyle needs? Consider factors such as weight, portability, and compatibility with strollers to ensure the car seat fits your lifestyle

Convertible Car Seats

A convertible car seat is a type of car seat that can be used from infancy to toddlerhood, and sometimes even beyond. Unlike infant car seats, which are rearfacing only and used until around the first year of life, convertible car seats can be used both rear-facing and forward-facing. They're called "convertible" because they can be converted from a rear-facing position to a forward-facing position, depending on the age and size of your child.

Convertible car seats are a must-have to keep baby safe beyond the use of your infant car seat and travel system, and some parents skip an infant seat and start with this right away (though I do recommend reading through the pros and cons of both convertible and infant car seats before making that decision!).

Pros

- Longer lifespan: Convertible car seats can be used from infancy through toddlerhood and beyond, so you don't need to buy a new car seat as your child grows
- **Cost-effective:** While convertible car seats may be more expensive upfront, they can ultimately save you money in the long run since you won't need to purchase separate seats
- **More versatile:** Convertible car seats can be installed both rear-facing and forward-facing, giving you more flexibility and options. You can also find options that will work with your car and unique car seat set-up. And some even swivel for easy access when getting baby in and out!

Cons

- Heavier and bulkier: Convertible car seats tend to be larger and heavier than infant car seats, which can make them more difficult to move between vehicles or carry with you on-the-go
- Less convenient: Convertible car seats are meant to stay in the car - meaning you can't transport your baby in this car seat. They are also not compatible with travel systems

Infant Car Seats

Infant car seats are specifically designed for infants and younger babies, and are rear-facing only. These car seats typically attach to a base that stays in your car at all times, making it easy to move your baby in and out of the car without disturbing their sleep.

We recommend purchasing multiple bases for yours and your partner's cars to avoid having to switch the base out. Bases are far less expensive than the actual car seat, so this can be a cost-effective way to make your life easier!

Pros

- **More portable:** Infant car seats are typically smaller and lighter than convertible car seats, making them easier to carry and transport
- **More specialized:** Infant car seats are designed specifically for newborns and provide a secure and snug fit for smaller babies
- **More convenient:** If you use a stroller frequently, many infant car seats can be easily attached and removed from compatible strollers (see travel systems listed above)







Nipples

When you purchase bottles for your baby, they should come with nipples too. However, some new mamas may not know that nipples actually come in different sizes. Don't worry though, most brands have nipple sizes ranging from 0 to 3 and this correlates to how large the opening is for milk flow rates.

Typically, a newborn will start with a size 0 and then the size will be increased as baby gets older. It's important to note that all babies transition to bigger nipple sizes at different rates, and some may not even make it to a size 3.

My recommendation would be to make sure you have some size 0 and size 1 nipples for when you first bring baby home, and then you can get larger sizes at a later time if and when it's needed.

As you create your baby registry or stock up on supplies, you may want to consider adding a small amount of formula even if you're planning to breastfeed! This is just in case breastfeeding doesn't go as planned or if you know you want to supplement with formula.

However, it's important to note that you may not want to get too much formula in advance, as you won't know if it will agree with your baby until they try it. Choosing a formula can sometimes be a process of trial and error, as every baby is different.

Starting with a small amount and gradually figuring out what works best for your little one is a good approach.





Breast Pumps



We are going to start off this section with breast pumps because I know that this process can be overwhelming! And whether you plan on exclusively breastfeeding, pumping, or you're not really sure what you're going to do - a breast pump is a must-have item for many new moms.

Did you know that thanks to the Affordable Care Act, insurance providers are required to cover breastfeeding support, counseling, and equipment? This means that you have coverage for one breast pump per pregnancy (up to one year postpartum).

One great resource for obtaining a breast pump is *Aeroflow Breastpumps*. They make it easy for you to get your pump by handling the insurance process for you!

In some cases, your insurance plan may only cover the most basic pumps, but you can pay the difference for upgrades. In this section, you'll learn about different types of pumps and look at the pros and cons so you can choose the one that works best for you and your lifestyle.

Manual Pumps aka Hand Pumps

Hand pumps are a type of manual breast pump that are operated by hand, usually with a pumping motion. They are generally smaller and more portable than electric breast pumps, making them a great option for on-the-go pumping or occasional use.





However, they can be more time-consuming and tiring to use than electric pumps, and may not be as effective at emptying the breast. Some mamas find hand pumps to be a more affordable option, and others simply prefer the control and comfort that they offer. I think it's always a good idea to have a manual pump on hand as a backup, even if you plan to primarily use an electric pump.

Tip: Because manual pumps are usually far less expensive than electric ones, use your insurance for an electric pump and purchase a manual pump out of pocket.

Pros

- **Affordable:** Manual breast pumps are typically less expensive than electric pumps, which makes them a budget-friendly option
- **Portable:** Since they don't require electricity or batteries, manual pumps are very portable and can be used anywhere
- **Quiet:** Unlike electric pumps, manual pumps don't make any noise, which can be beneficial for moms who don't want to disturb others while pumping
- **Easy to clean:** Manual pumps usually have fewer parts and are easier to clean than electric pumps
- **Control:** With manual pumps, moms have more control over the suction and pumping speed, which can be helpful for comfort and milk production

Cons

- **Tiring:** Using a manual pump requires hand and arm strength, which can be tiring, especially if you need to pump frequently
- **Time-consuming:** Manual pumping is usually slower than electric pumping, which means it may take more time to empty the breast

Electric Breast Pumps

Electric breast pumps are a popular option for moms who plan on pumping regularly. These pumps come in both single and double options, and can be more efficient than manual pumps.

With electric pumps, you can adjust the speed and suction level to find what works best for you. Many electric pumps also have the ability to pump both breasts at once, which can save you a lot of time.

However, electric pumps can be pricey and require an outlet or battery power to function. They also tend to be a bit louder and less portable than manual pumps. Overall, electric pumps are a great choice for moms who plan to pump frequently or exclusively.

Pros

- **Faster and more efficient:** Electric breast pumps are usually more efficient than manual pumps, allowing you to pump more milk in less time
- Adjustable suction strength and speed: Most electric pumps allow you to adjust the suction strength and speed to find the most comfortable and effective pumping setting for you

Section 8: Clothing

Dressing your baby can be a fun and exciting part of preparing for their arrival. In this section, we'll guide you through the must-have clothing items for your baby, including onesies, sleepers, and outerwear. We'll also provide tips on sizing and selecting clothing for your baby's first year.

Sizing

First, let's talk about baby clothes sizing in general. Talk to any mom and she will tell you no two brands are the same when it comes to weight and height associated with a size range.

You will learn in the first few months what brands work well for your baby but before then, some of it will require guess work.

Here are some general tips on baby clothes sizing I wish I had known:

- For brands that just give a single month for the size, consider that the upper limit (ie - Carters)
- Most brands do give height and weight suggestions for their size ranges but you may need to search for the size chart online
- Find out what you and your partner were like as babies. Always in the next size up? Always on the smaller side? This may give you an idea of what to expect
- I have found boutique brands to run on the smaller side. This is not a hard and fast rule, but it occurred often enough for me that I'd be aware of it
- When in doubt, always keep the tags on and exchange for a bigger size or store credit. Even if you don't get full value, it's better than wasted clothes baby never wore



How many clothes items do I need in each size?

This is tricky to navigate because you just can't predict how fast baby will grow in order to shop seasonally for the appropriate size. However, the basics and essentials listed above will be used until your baby is walking, so investing in those numbers through size 12-18 months is probably a safe bet.

Basics like snap-crotch body suits, footed pajamas, and stretchy pants are going to be your mainstays even as baby gets mobile. I found myself shying away from any shirts that didn't snap until my boys were walking. Shirts tend to ride up and get twisted with wiggling, crawling babies. You can pull out the cute pull-overs once they start walking.

How many onesies do I need in each size?

On the low end, you're going to want to have at least 6 onesies in each size throughout baby's first year. The same is true for bodysuits and footed pajamas. Don't plan too far out in the realm of more seasonal items because you can't predict baby's growth.

Baby clothes checklist for the first year

Use this as a basic essentials checklist and plan to fill in with seasonal and more specialized-wear.

For each size range (0-3, 3-6, 6-9, 9-12 months) plan to get:

- 6 short-sleeved bodysuits
- 6 long-sleeved bodysuits
- 6 stretchy pants
- 6 one-pieces (long or jumper-style depending on season)
- 6 cotton footed PJs (fleece can be great for winter months)

Baby Clothes Functionality vs Style

As you can see, in my checklists I am emphasizing functionality. I know baby clothes are adorable, believe me. But other than on very special occasions, it's just not worth the hassle of getting them into fussy outfits.

Certainly splurge or enjoy an adorable Christmas outfit or something for a big family party, but day to day, you want simple.

To be totally honest, I'm a big fan of just onesies for newborns. They are pretty inexpensive, easy to spray and throw in the wash, come in short sleeve and long sleeve depending on the weather, and can be worn with a little pair of pants if it's cold.

Oh, and they usually come in packs of 3-5 or even more! I cover some of my favorite pants for babies below, but it might not be a bad idea to stock up on some season specific items too.

Bodysuits/Onesies

I would recommend grabbing a pack of both long and short sleeves, no matter the season. I often put my summer baby in long-sleeved bodysuits and loved the ones with little fold-overs on the sleeve to prevent them from scratching.

Just to make sure we're on the same page: bodysuits are the shirts with the snaps at the crotch. It prevents the shirt from riding up and is easy for diaper changes. Often, the neck is designed so that when there is a blow-out you can simply pull the shirt down and off and not deal with poop going over the head.

Footed Pajamas

Don't go too crazy in the newborn size with these, but having a few (especially if baby is born in a colder month) are great for hanging around the house when they aren't swaddled or to keep them warm at night. As far as size 0-3 and beyond, these are good to stock up on!

Now when it comes to footie PJs there are two main styles - snaps and zippers.

Zippers are quick and easy to use - no aligning snaps or buttons in the dark at night. They also usually provide a snugger fit than snaps, which can help keep your baby's diaper in place. However, zippers can sometimes snag on delicate fabrics or irritate your baby's skin if they're not covered by a protective flap.

As for snaps, they give more flexibility in terms of opening the pajamas for diaper changes, as you can snap and unsnap just the bottom portion. However, snaps can be more time-consuming to fasten and unfasten, especially if you have a squirmy baby who doesn't like to stay still.

All of this is to say that the choice between snaps and zippers will depend on your personal preference and your baby's needs! I recommend having a few of both options on hand, so you can switch between the two depending on the situation.

Note: If you have a winter baby, or keep your house particularly chilly, you may want to get some fleece footed pajamas in addition to cotton ones.

Laundry Detergent

- **Hypoallergenic:** Opt for a detergent that is labeled as hypoallergenic, meaning it is less likely to cause an allergic reaction
- Gentle formula: Choose a detergent with a gentle formula that is free of harsh chemicals and additives
- **pH-balanced:** Look for a detergent that is pH-balanced, as this can help prevent skin irritation
- **Liquid vs powder:** Liquid detergents are generally considered better for newborns because they dissolve more easily and leave fewer residue
- Free of optical brighteners: Optical brighteners can leave residue on clothes and irritate sensitive skin, so look for a detergent that is free of them
- **Pediatrician recommended:** Consider looking for a detergent that is recommended by pediatricians, as this can help ensure that it is safe and effective for your newborn

Remember, every baby's skin is different, so you may need to try a few different detergents before finding one that works well for your little one!

But don't stress about this too much for the first wash you do on clothes before baby is born.






